

Leeds City Council Public Health provide funding for the Winter Wellbeing Community Grants Scheme, which is topped up by donations from the public. The fund supports community-based projects that help vulnerable people in Leeds who are most susceptible to the adverse effects of cold weather. Grants are awarded to varied projects addressing wellbeing in winter, with a focus on tackling social isolation, increasing resilience and that helping reduce the levels of illness (and deaths) due to vulnerable people living in cold housing.
